

Initially Marge and other volunteers helped staff the library for just a day and a half a week, creating a rota of 10 volunteers to staff the library counter, with paid Council staff covering the other days.



Now the Community Library is open more days a week and Marge is responsible for producing a monthly rota for 60 volunteers - and also looks after them, trains and nurtures them!

Lovely libraries




This lovely little library was spotted in Rugby, Tennessee. It was sponsored by the Victorian writer and parliamentarian Thomas Hughes, who wrote Tom Brown's Schooldays. Hughes had become worried about the plight of the second sons of English clergy and planned a 'Model Village' - like Saltaire - in the depths of the

Tennessee countryside where they could tend the land and improve themselves.

The library dating from 1882 still houses 7,000 leather bound books on all subjects, including a First Edition Tom Brown's Schooldays of course. (Leeds library was opened in 1884)
